2. Other Related Measure With HFMD Outbreak

Summary of disease updates.

- There are **7,972** cumulative cases with **114** new cases detected. The highest number of new cases was from **Miri** Division followed by **Kuching** and **Sibu** Divisions respectively.
- **21** new hospital admissions were reported.

School Closure Updates.

- 15 primary schools reopened today, remaining 18 still closed. ACD team will inspect these 15 schools today for screening of cases.

ACD Screening In Pre-Schools / Kindergarten / TADIKA.

- **Sibu Division:** Out of 199 suspected cases detected yesterday, 50 turned up in A&E hospital Sibu for further confirmation. Out of those 50, only one was confirmed as HFMD. The ACD team will re visit and follow up on the remaining today.
- **Mukah Division:** All 13 suspected cases were found to be free of HFMD.
